Greetings from UVA!

We begin this new academic year with great hope and optimism. Here in Charlottesville, we spent the summer welcoming families back to the University Grounds for UVA student-led tours, and this fall we are planning for our students to return to in-person classes and a full menu of activities and events. There is a level of energy and excitement here that has been lacking for the last 18 months, and for this we are incredibly grateful.

Although we are beginning to return to some semblance of normalcy, Covid-19 has not been extinguished, and many of your students and families might still be struggling and in need of guidance, comfort, resources, and support.

We are grateful for all you do to assist families, and we pledge to do everything humanly possible to simplify our admission process and share information that we hope will help you and your students as they navigate the college admission process this year.

With this in mind, we would like to share a few updates that we hope will help as you begin to meet with students in the fall.

On-Grounds Tours and Events — We are excited to share that we will continue to host visitors to Grounds for in-person tours during the fall term. Registration for tours can be found on our website.

Test Optional — We have extended our Test Optional admission policy through 2023. Standardized testing is not required for admission and students who do not submit testing will not be disadvantaged in our application review.

Undocumented and DACA students living in Virginia who attend a Virginia high school for at least two years and graduate will be eligible to receive Virginia tuition rates and need-based financial aid beginning in 2022.

Jefferson Scholarship — The new Walenta Scholarship is a merit based scholarship program specifically for first generation college students. Recipients will receive four year, merit-based scholarships that cover the full cost of attendance.

Inclusive Excellence – UVA is implementing the strategic Inclusive Excellence (IE) framework to synergize and support our collective diversity, equity, inclusion, and belonging efforts.

Additionally, it's important to note that UVA remains committed to offering the best need-based financial aid program for a public institution in the country.

- ALL Virginia undergraduate students with a family income of less than \$80,000 are eligible to receive financial aid covering the full cost tuition, as well as University and school fees for up to eight semesters.
- ALL Virginia undergraduate students with a family income of less than \$30,000 are eligible to receive full tuition, University and school fees, and housing and dining expenses for up to eight semesters.
- We are need blind in our admission policies and UVA meets 100% of financial need for all U.S. students, including non-Virginia residents.
- The University Achievement Awards, Ridley and Holland Scholarships, and the Blue Ridge Scholars program provide further assistance by reducing the loan component for incoming students with exceptional promise and financial need.

This year will be challenging, for everyone. We know you and your students will have questions. We will do our best to be flexible and transparent. Please know we are here to help. During times like these, we are especially grateful to partner with you to best serve and support your resilient, dedicated, deserving students.







ACADEMIC RANKINGS

The University of Virginia ranks among the nation's best colleges and universities. Since U.S. News began a separate listing of the top 50 public universities, UVA has been ranked fourth or higher. In the 2021 rankings edition, we placed 4th among public universities and 26th among all national universities.

SCHOLARS PROGRAMS: THE ECHOLS, RODMAN, AND COLLEGE SCIENCE SCHOLARS (CSS)

The Echols, Rodman, and College Science Scholars (CSS) programs are three honors programs at the University of Virginia. No special application is required for admission to these programs; everyone who applies for admission is automatically considered. In selecting candidates for the Echols and Rodman programs, the Committee on Admission looks for applicants who have excelled academically and exhibit unusual intellectual curiosity. Students selected to CSS have demonstrated a desire to perform scientific research at the University.
