Introduction

Dear Colleague,

With so much happening in the world, we sincerely hope you are staying safe and doing well. Thank you for your continued partnership and for you all you do to serve and assist students and families. We would like to take this opportunity to provide you with information regarding application fee waivers, travel grants, resources for undocumented students and those with DACA status, scholarship opportunities, and financial aid deadlines and reminders. UVA continues to have a commitment to access and affordability. Specifically, the University:

- (1) Accepts students solely on their academic merit, regardless of their ability to pay
- (2) Covers 100% of demonstrated financial need. This means UVA covers the full amount that families are unable to pay, through scholarships, grants, work-study and low interest loans.
- (3) *Limits student debt.* UVA limits loans to an average of \$4,500 per year for in-state students. Low-income, in-state students receive only \$1,000 per year in loans.

We know that the work you do is critically important to the success of your students. If there is anything we can do to help you during the admission process, please do not hesitate to contact us. We look forward to working with you as we continue to help students achieve their dreams.

Application Fee Waivers, Travel Grants, Resources for Undocumented Students

Common Application Fee Waivers

UVA wants to make sure that application fees do not pose a barrier for any student. Travel Grants

VAAN – Virginia Alumni Admission Network

Scholarships

The University of Virginia offers several scholarship opportunities for incoming students. You can nominate students for the University Achievement Award and the Oliver Linwood Perry Jr. Scholarship through our <u>Counselor Nomination Form</u>. The deadline for the Counselor Nomination Form is *Friday, January* **13**, **2023**. Review each scholarship below.

University Achievement Award – Full tuition & fees scholarship that is renewable for four years for eligible students from Virginia. Learn more about eligibility <u>here</u>. All in-state applicants are automatically considered for this award. Additionally, you are welcome to nominate students for the scholarship <u>here</u>.

Oliver Linwood Perry Jr. Scholarship – The Oliver Linwood Perry Jr. Scholarship is for a student attending UVA who has demonstrated a history of service with Native American and Indigenous communities. For a more detailed description of the scholarship, click <u>here</u>. *Additionally, you are welcome to nominate students for the scholarship <u>here</u>.*

Blue Ridge Scholarship – Scholarship ranges from \$1,000 to \$7,000 per year and may replace the loan or work study component of a financial aid package. All students with significant financial need are automatically considered for this award.

Ridley Scholarship Program – Full tuition & fees scholarship that is renewable for four years. The Ridley Scholarship Program seeks to attract Black and African-American identified students of the highest academic caliber and build a community of learning, leadership, and legacy for Black students at UVA. Walentas Scholarship – The Walentas Scholars Program covers the entire cost of attendance for a total of eight semesters. The scholarship is for students who are the first or among the first in their families to earn a bachelor's degree from a college or university. Jefferson Scholarship – The Jefferson Scholarship covers the entire cost of attendance for a total of eight semesters. Selection of recipients will be based on merit alone in the areas of leadership, scholarship, and citizenship. The nomination deadline is **December 1, 2022**.
