Introduction

Dear Colleague,

With so much happening in the world, we sincerely hope you are staying safe and doing well. Thank you for your continued partnership and for all you do to serve and assist your students and families. We would like to take this opportunity to provide you with information regarding **application fee waivers, resources for undocumented students and those with DACA status, scholarship opportunities, and financial aid deadlines and reminders.** UVA continues to have a commitment to [access and affordability](#). Specifically, the University:

- (1) *Accepts students solely on their academic merit*, regardless of their ability to pay
- (2) *Covers 100% of demonstrated financial need*. This means UVA covers the full amount that families are unable to pay, through scholarships, grants, work-study and low interest loans.
- (3) *Limits student debt*. UVA limits loans to an average of \$4,500 per year for in-state students. Low-income, in-state students receive only \$1,000 per year in loans.
- (4) *Has expanded financial aid for Virginia families*. The AccessUVA expansion includes grants and scholarships for Virginia families with an income of \$150,000 or less.

We know that the work you do is critically important to the success of your students. If there is anything we can do to help you during the admission process, please do not hesitate to contact us. We look forward to working with you as we continue to help students achieve their dreams.

Scholarships

The University of Virginia offers several scholarship opportunities for incoming students. You can nominate students for select scholarships through our [Counselor Nomination Form](#). The deadline for the Counselor Nomination Form is **Wednesday, January 31, 2024**. Review each scholarship below.

University Achievement Award – Full tuition & fees scholarship that is renewable for four years for eligible students from Virginia. Learn more about eligibility [here](#). *All in-state applicants are automatically considered for this award.*

Blue Ridge Scholarship – Scholarship ranges from \$1,000 to \$7,000 per year and may replace the loan or work study component of a financial aid package. All students with significant financial need are automatically considered for this award.

Davis First-Generation Scholarship – Created in 2023 to attract outstanding first-generation students to UVA by minimizing the gap in financial aid that they might otherwise have to fill with loans.

Alumni Scholarships The alumni association sponsors several scholarships for both incoming and current undergraduate students. The University of Virginia Alumni Association administers more than 250 different scholarships ranging from modest stipends to full tuition, room and board. Many of these scholarships are available through an application process independent of the University's financial aid process while others are based on other criteria such as regional areas.
